World Record Auction Prices

Decovs

- Sold in 1986 for \$319,000 to Russell B. Aitken Sunny Vonbulow's stepfather, later sold at Christie's for \$800,000, and again in 2007 \$1.13 million
- Another famous decoy, the Elmer Crowell preening goose, was purchased by me for \$48,000 in 1984, then a world record price. I was the underbidder in the Sotheby's 2000. Jim McClarey auction at \$670,000. It sold for \$680,000

• In 1992, sold two decoys, 'The Preening Drake and Hen Mallard," by the Caines brothers of South Carolina for a world record price of \$285,000. The decoys were from the estate of Jean Yawkey (late owner of the Boston Red Sox).

- American Simon Willard clock at \$440,000 (still a world record) known as the infamous "Boston Tea Party Clock."
- Held most of the world records in 1978 for Arts & Crafts, Gustav Stickley furniture and Art Potter

Art/Paintings

- Miniature of Gilbert Stuart painting on ivory by Sara Goodrich to the National Portrait Gallery for \$7,000, a record price in 1991

 "The Hunter's Still Life" \$187,000, also is the highest price paid for an art object in Maine
- Sold a painting by European artist Samuel Scott to a private London collector for a world price of \$132,000
- Received a world record price of \$85,000 for a Folk Art painting by M.W. Hopkins of a little girl, (Virgina Ada Wright) with a dog. The painting was featured on the front cover Sotheby's 2004 America flyer and sold for \$225,000

Guns/Military/Misc.

- Sold the Family Coast of Arms or hatchment for the first family of Rhode Island to the Smithsonian Institute for a world record \$57,000
- Set world record prices for firearms including a World Famous Remington single shot rifle from the Jack Appel collection for \$32,000
- Winchester Mode186 sold for \$35,000
- Set record prices for Civil War and military memorabilia.

The Andrew H. Green Estate Auction, 2010

Andrew H. Green (1843-1898) was known as "The Father of New York" and is credited with bringing together the five boroughs in New York City; In 1869 he headed the Central Park Commission resulting in the creation of Central Park. Mr. Green was also instrumental in the creation of The American Museum of Natural History, The Metropolitan Museum of Art and The Bronx Zoo.

- Taking one year to prepare, the sale was comprised of six auctions over a five-day period, with approximately 2500 items sold. Auction was featured on the Times Square Billboard
- Significant participation of the bidders included the Smithsonian Institute, the New York Public Library, the New York Historical Society the Farnsworth Museum, and others
- The accumulation of many generations included vintage clothing. books & ephemera: glass, china, silver; paintings & antiques; toys & dolls

The Historical Collection of the Late William ("Billy") Pate was sold in 2012. Billy Pate was a world-class fly fisherman of over 35 years and held many world records. Billy's estate collection included over 500 lots of fishing collectibles, memorabilia and other related items.
